NNSY History

A former shipyard Apprentice was a Tuskegee WWII pilot. This article was written in honor of February's national Black History Month and about an NNSY apprentice who made history in his own right, by helping to break racial barriers and achieve career milestones during the World War II, Korean and Vietnam Wars and beyond.

Carter was born near the Naval Weapons Station near Yorktown, Virginia, in 1922 and died in 2018 at the age of 95, after serving 27 years in the NYPD.

Selected a Sheet Metal Shop Apprentice in mid-1942, he took military leave in late 1943 and joined the U.S. Army Air Corps. He

became a member of the Tuskegee Airmen, the distinguished group of Black pilots and support personnel, who



bravely protected our aircraft when they bombed enemy targets over Europe during WWII.
